November Masses will be offered for all Holy Souls collectively, rather than for individual requests. Individual Mass requests cannot be made in November. They are available the rest of the year.

RESTRICTIONS ON OUR CHURCHES

- We must observe the **four-square metre rule**. **Please do not sit in seats that are not available.**
- Families may sit together, but if people do not belong in the same household, they must observe physical distancing of 1.5 metres.
- Vaccination is recommended for all parishioners.
- **Masks are compulsory for attending Mass.** Only the priest and reader (when reading) are exempt.
- Congregational singing is not allowed yet.
- The sign of peace and passing of the collection plate continue to be suspended.
- **When preparing to receive Holy Communion, parishioners are asked to go seat by seat to enable more distancing between others who are in the line. Please go from the nearest seat to the Priest or Acolyte but please wait until there is space to join the queue before standing up.**
- ANYONE who enters the church must give their names and contact details before entering the church. These records will be kept for four weeks or use the QR code at the doors.
- Only one door will be opened to enable accurate recording of those attending.
- Hands must be sanitised when entering the church.
- Please do not come to the church if you are unwell.
- If a confirmed case of COVID-19 occurs in our parish, every person who has registered as an attendee of the parish will be notified of the diagnosis and the date and time the infected person attended the church. No other details will be provided.
- The situation with weddings and funerals is complicated! Even though unvaccinated people are normally allowed to gather in the church, in the case of weddings and funerals, if some of the attendees are not vaccinated, then the numbers are limited to 5 at a wedding and 10 at a funeral. If all the attendees at a wedding or funeral are fully vaccinated, there is no limit on numbers (subject to the 4sqm rules).

PLANNED GIVING ENVELOPES

As we get back to regular Masses, please assist the parish and those who count the money each week by making it easier for them. If you use the Planned Giving Envelopes, we ask that you **do not** put a donation in every single envelope for the weeks you have missed. Please just put your total donation in ONE envelope. The computer recording system only records the total donation on any given date, not the individual donations for every week that you put an envelope in. e.g. you have missed 10 weeks of Mass, just use one envelope and put your donation in any one of dates. If you normally give \$5 a week, then put \$50 in one envelope not \$5 in 10 envelopes. Please recycle the unused envelopes in your yellow recycling bin.
