HOW TO RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION

Catholics who have made the proper spiritual and sacramental preparation may come forward in the procession to receive Holy Communion.

To receive the sacred host, please hold your hands open flat and then consume the host in the presence of the priest or communion minister before moving back to your seat.



If you are not Catholic or have not yet received your First Communion, you may receive a blessing from the priest.

An Acolyte or Minister of Holy Communion cannot give you a blessing. To receive a blessing approach the priest in the Communion procession with your arms crossed over your chest.
